THROUGH MY EYES Best 2018/2019 Choreographic Work at the Prix de la Danse

Montr  al, Monday, October 28, 2019 – This afternoon, **H  l  ne Langevin**, artistic director and choreographer of **Bouge de l  **, won the **Prix du CALQ for Best choreographic work in Quebec 2018–2019** at the **Prix de la danse de Montr  al** for her most recent creation, *Through My Eyes*. This award, along with a \$10,000 grant, was presented by Ms. V  ronique Fontaine, Director of Support for creative organizations at the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Qu  bec, during a ceremony held at the Espace Orange Fran  oise Sullivan in the Wilder Building | Espace Danse. It’s the first time the award has been won by a dance work aimed at young audiences. The timing is perfect too, for Bouge de l   is about to celebrate its 20th anniversary this coming January!

THE PERFECT BIRTHDAY GIFT

In a state of feverish excitement, H  l  ne Langevin was emotional as she humbly accepted the award: “I feel very honoured to receive the CALQ award for Best Choreography. I’m really moved! With Bouge de l   about to celebrate its 20th anniversary in 2020, this kind of recognition is definitely the perfect birthday gift! As I’m sure you know, children have always been the centre of my universe; I love creating for them and, as a choreographer, I feel free in in my creation. They are certainly a demanding audience; in the theatre, it can quickly turn into chaos! But if they like what they see, if they’re moved by it, they are so generous and receptive... Receiving this award is also a way to show my peers and people in my field that dance aimed specifically at young audiences is very much a discipline in its own right. When creating a dance work for the young, you need creativity, expressiveness, sensitivity, rigour and a good idea of what it’s like to be a child, and it requires performers to have a solid technical background and outstanding communication skills on stage. It’s more than important: it’s through them that dance enters into the hearts and minds of children. So it’s with gratitude – and great pride – that I share this honour with all those with whom I worked together on the show!”

"The movement, scenography, lighting, costumes, music – it all comes together to create an utterly captivating show. From start to finish, the choices are smart, creative and remarkable. You can feel the expertise at work, and there is a particular attention to detail." *Through My Eyes* was created in September 2018 at the Maison culturelle et communautaire de Montréal-Nord, where the company has been based since 2006. The show is running from December 4th to January 5th at Maison Théâtre, as a family show during the holiday season.

BOUGE DE LÀ

Established in 2000 by Hélène Langevin, Bouge de là creates and performs high-quality works of dance for young audiences, and engages in community outreach through its development of a multitude of cultural mediation activities. The company remains one of the rare professional dance companies in Quebec devoted exclusively to the creation of dance works for children. By fusing dance with other artistic disciplines (video, theatre, shadow play), the company offers contemporary dance performances full of humour and poetry. It has eight works in its repertoire; *Through My Eyes*, created in 2018, is its most recent creation.

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ABOUT THE SHOW | THROUGH MY EYES

A dancer enters the stage and discovers a ball. Intrigued, she moves toward it, carefully. As soon as she touches it, the magic of the stage is unleashed: the lights go up, the decor appears all around her, shadows play their tricks... and transform one dancer into many! Now there are four of her, to play together and discover a constantly changing environment: a graphical world made up of forms, colours, textures, sounds, and illusions. A topsy-turvy playground where dance continually shifts with the context, this performance full of surprises invites audiences to see the world afresh through the eyes of a child who ex-plores.

An ode to the power of imagination, *Through My Eyes* stimulates the child's senses and brings us back to one of the loveliest things about childhood: a tireless capacity for wonder.
